GUILD MEETING NOTES from last Sunday – We discussed the upcoming Fall Dinner, which will be on Sunday, October 27th. We are working making changes based on feedback from last year: • Finding a place for the handicap to wait instead of going up the ramp and coming down again. • Selling tickets dine-in and take-out tickets at the same table, which seemed to cause a lot of confusion last year. • Trying to get the entire take-out area all in the viewing area instead of stringing it out. • Cutting pies – they should be cut in 6 pieces, unless a large pie or a small pie. Some of the pieces were very small last year. Also deciding if we ask for specific pies – pumpkin, cherry, apple, soft pies – we seem to run out of pumpkin all the time. • Changing the serving line- we will serve the turkey and the people will fill their own plates with the rest of the food. Had many comments that there was too much food on their plates last year. We will be eliminating the cranberries, as they hard to get and very expensive for the amount used. We have ladies volunteering to make bread & butter refrigerator pickles that we will serve. The refrigerator has lots of them already. **WORKER LISTS** will be out on October 6th with your worker assignments, how many pies you are asked to donate, and a reminder about bake sale (we are always needing items!). There will also be a note for the turkey fund; if you wish to donate, please put in an envelope marked “turkeys” and place in collection. We are getting the turkeys from S & S locker in Osage again this year. They are cooked and cut up and arrive hot to serve. It costs about \$1,000.00 more to have them cook them and carved, but this is a time-saver and safer option, thus the need for additional donations. Thanks to the Kitchen Chairs: Jenny Akins and Tammy Hrubetz; and the Dining Room Chairs: Renee Laudner, Sarah Johnson, Julie Sheriff, and Mary Shupe. They have been doing this for quite a few years.
