There will be pews in the front of the church marked off for social distancing, if you choose, the rest of the pews will be open seating. Hand sanitizer will be available. Archbishop Jackels has lifted the dispensation on not attending Mass during the pandemic. This means that we are now required to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation.

COMMUNITY BREAKFAST for the 151-year celebration was a good success. The ladies of the 3 parishes in town – Lutheran, Methodist, and Catholic – worked together to serve the breakfast and it was nice to see everyone having a good time. The bake sale brought in \$357.00 and the breakfast brought in \$843.00 after expenses. That left a profit of \$1200.00 divided by the 3 parishes each parish receiving \$400.00! Thanks to everyone who donated to the bake sale and to those who worked at the breakfast.

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL is around the corner. We will be holding it at the Methodist church on July 22nd, 23rd, and 24th. Registration forms are available in the back of church. IRISH FAIR was a good day. The income was \$11,163.05. Waiting to gather all the bills to see the final actual profit. WINNERS of the raffle drawing were Maya Rowe \$500.00; Crayton Dick and Landon Showalter \$100.00 each; Lori Sprung and Jeremy Sturges \$50.00 each; Troy Pitzengerger, Janice Noss, Dan Cahalan, and Deb Barnes \$25.00 each, for a total of \$900.00. Thanks to everyone who helped with everything, to those who donated items, to those who went out and solicited items, and to those who donated items for the sack raffle and auction – without all of that we would not have a sack raffle or an auction. The auction brought in \$5,810.00 of the \$11,163.05. This is all profit because of all the donations. Not many raffle tickets were sold this year: \$1,925.00 minus \$900.00 prizes leaves profit of \$1,025.00.

FUNDRAISER PARKING LOT winner of the \$10,000.00 was Tracy Shreckengost of Sheffield; winners of \$1,000.00 was Michelle Foell and Paulette Gabel. Not all the 300 tickets were sold but thanks to everyone who worked hard at selling and those who bought tickets. 255 tickets were sold for a total of \$ 25,500.00. After the prizes were paid it left \$13,500.00 to go towards the parking lot. AWESOME!! LOOKS like the parking lot should be done later this month!

CEMETERY MEETING – A meeting was held recently, it was decided that some decorative trees could be planted along the fence on the new part of the cemetery. Also we decided to change our rules regarding setting of stones in the cemetery. After checking with surrounding cemeteries they do not allow anyone but the designated person to set a stone in their cemeteries, so we have decided to change our rule that no one but our designated person will set stones in our cemetery. At this time our designated person is Junior Johnson. Martin Barnes is mowing the cemetery again this year.
